



In the matter of the Complaint

voter registration address

WHEREAS, on or about October 16, 2024, the Division of Election Law Enforcement (DELE) received a complaint alleging that the complainant’s mother-in-law’s home health aide had received mail at the mother-in-law’s address. The complaint included a picture of an envelope from the Staten Island Office of the New York City Board of Elections addressed to the aide at the mother-in-law’s address, which was located in Brooklyn. The complainant stated the aide did not have permission to use their mother-in-law’s address; and

WHEREAS, DELE staff reviewed the NYS Voter database information for registered voters with that Brooklyn address and found that two people were registered at the address on the envelope: the mother-in-law and a person with a different name than the home health aide. The home health aide’s name did not appear in the database. It should be noted that the DELE has no authority over where individuals receive mail; and

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing, this matter is closed with no further enforcement action.
